- 1. How does Peter's mom feel when he brings home his prize?
- 2. What is the biggest problem in Peter's life?
- 3. How does the experience of having a turtle as a pet different from having a cat or a dog as a pet? What are the advantages and disadvantages of having a turtle?
- 4. Why does Peter's dad spend so much time watching commercials on TV?
- 5. What are some advantages and disadvantages of being an older sibling?

## Chapter 2

- 1. How does Peter feel when he finds out he's going to be sharing his room with Fudge when the Yarby's visit?
- 2. What does the phrase "cooked up a storm" mean?
- 3. Peter thanks Mrs. Yarby for the dictionary and says that it's just what he always wanted even though this is not really how he feels. Why do you think Peter says this?
- 4. Mr. Yarby calls Mr. Hatcher by his last name and refers to Dribble as a "thing". What does this tell you about Mr. Yarby?
- 5. Mr. Hatcher collected all the cans of Juicy-O and dumped them in the garbage. Why did he do this?

# Chapter 3

- 1. Why is this chapter titled "The Family Dog"?
- 2. What did Mr. Hatcher really mean when he said "You will eat that cereal, or you will wear it"? Do you think this was a good way to solve the problem?
- 3. Doctors suggested different things for Mrs. Hatcher to do in order to get Fudge to eat, which doctor's advice do you agree with most?
- 4. When Fudge gets punished, Peter thinks, "This was turning out to be fun after all". What does this reveal about his feelings toward Fudge?
- 5. What does the phrase "Monkey Business" mean in the fifth paragraph?

#### Chapter 4

- 3. Describe Sheila from Peter's point of view and then describe Sheila from his mother's point of view.
- 4. Pretend you are Peter. Tell what you would have done differently in order to prevent Fudge's accident.
- 5. Pg. 27 Use the context clues to figure out what the word muggers means.

#### Chapter 5

- 1. Pg. 40 Peter and his mom argue about appropriate names to call his little brother. If you were part of this discussion, what would you say about calling him Fudge, Fang or Farley Drexel?
- 2. Name and describe the three guests at Fudge's birthday party?
- 3. How does Peter feel about how people use him to get Fudge to obey?
- 4. At the end of the chapter, Mom and Peter agree that 3 years old is too young for a birthday party. Do you agree or disagree?

- 1. Why do you think Judy Blume titled this chapter Fang Hits Town?
- 2. How did Peter get Fudge to try on shoes at the store? Why do you think Peter is able to get Fudge to do certain things and Mrs. Hatcher can't?
- 3. How did Mr. Hatcher's phrase "Eat it, or wear it" backfire at Hamburger Heaven?
- 4. How does Peter feel when his mom buys Fudge and him the same shoes? Do you agree or disagree with Mrs. Hatcher's decision?

- 1. Shelia and Peter disagree on how to solve the transportation problem in New York City. Which person do you agree with most?
