- 2. What is motivating the boys to make money?
- 3. What are some of the differences in the two lemonade stand signs?
- 4. What do you now think the war is referring to?

- 1. Why do you think the author switches back and forth between Evan and Jessie's point of view?
- 2. What does Jessie have a hard time understanding?
- 3. Why did Jessie choose Megan to help her with the lemonade stand?

Chapter Five

- 1. Why did Evan and Jessie agree not to argue in front of their mom?
- 2. Why did Evan not make much money on the first day of the lemonade stand?

3. Who do you think will win the bet and why?

- 2. What did Evan do for his lemonade stand to sell more cups?
